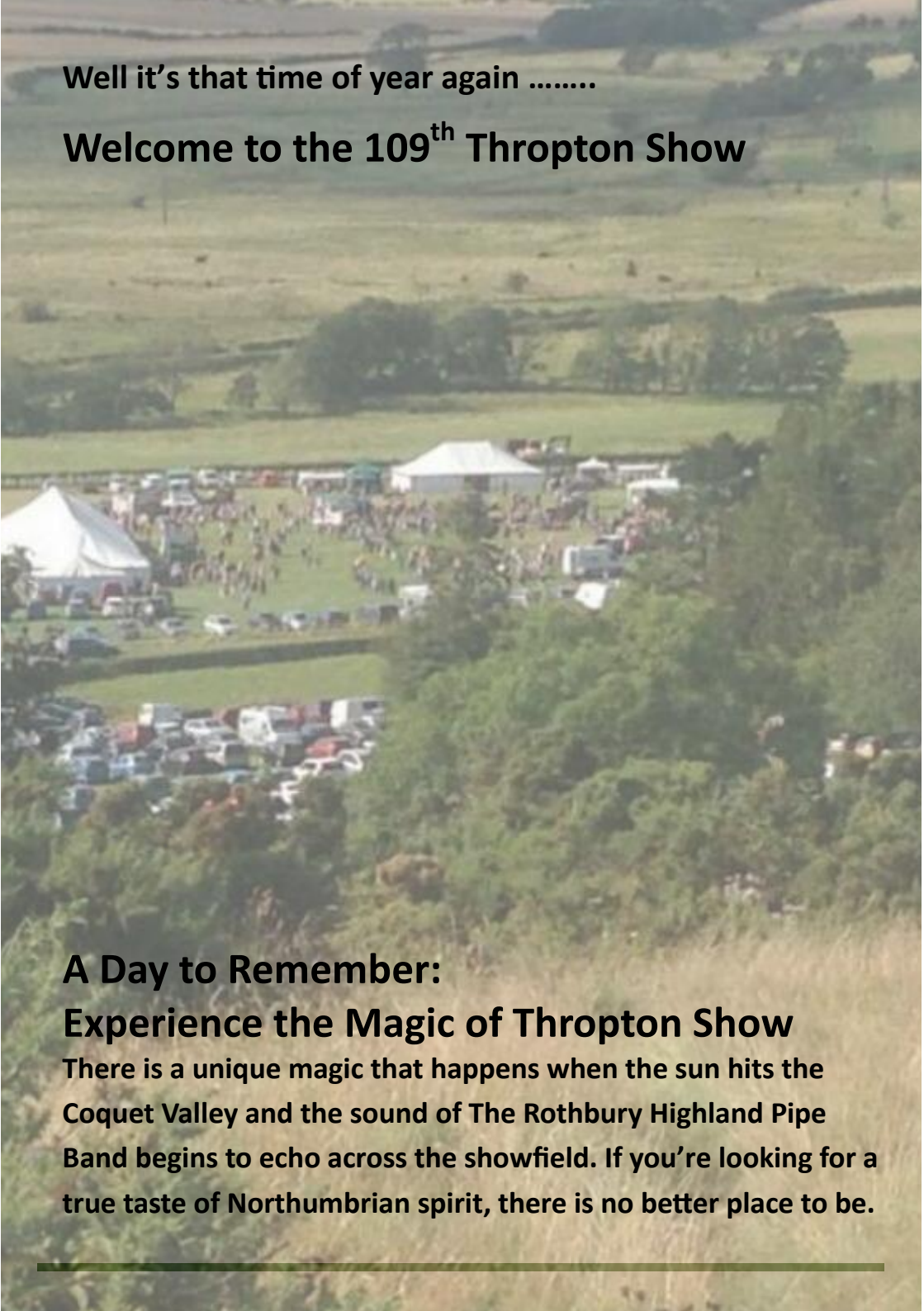

Fruited Tea Bread Recipe:

1lb Mixed Fruit, 6oz Soft Brown Sugar, Grated Rind 1 Orange or lemon, Cup of Hot Tea, 1 Egg (beaten), 8oz Self Raising Flour.

Overnight soak fruit, sugar and rind in tea. Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin.

Mix beaten egg into soaked fruit mixture and fold in flour. Pour into tin. (optional, sprinkle with demerara sugar or chopped nuts) Dot 8 small knobs of butter on top of bread. Bake for approximately 1hr 15mins at 325F/160C.

Show Tent Rules

The Society shall be ruled by a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and a Committee, any five of whom shall be competent to act, and to them be committed with the funds of the Society, and all matters connected herewith.

Only exhibitors and their assistants will be allowed to enter the show ground during the time of setting up exhibits. The doors are to be open for that purpose at 7.30 a.m. and cleared for the Judges at 10.45 a.m. Judging at 11.00 a.m.

That the Field be open to the Public at 12.00 noon. Tent to be opened at conclusion of judging, approx. 1 p.m.

ALL ARTICLES FOR COMPETITION MUST REMAIN ON THE TABLE UNTIL 4.00 p.m. unless authorised by the Chairman, Secretary and Committee for removal, and any exhibitor breaking this rule will be under penalty of 25p. Tent to be cleared by 4.30 p.m. All tickets to be shown to remove exhibits.

That competent judges be appointed to award the prizes, but they give no prize to articles they think unworthy of one. The judges' decision in all cases to be final.

ENTRIES FOR THE SHOW TAKEN UP TO 10.30 a.m. ON MORNING OF SHOW.

Exhibitors are held to declare all productions they exhibit for prizes are bona-fide their own growth, floral art classes excepted. Any person charging the exhibitor with breaking this rule must deposit 25p with the Secretary, which will be forfeited to the Society should he fail to make good his charge.

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Show Tent Rules

Exhibitors will be provided with numbers, when entering their exhibits. Numbers to be placed on the exhibits where they can be seen.

Any person touching or handling the vegetables etc., in the exhibition without consent of the owner, will subject himself to be expelled from the Show.

Exhibits, once placed, MUST NOT BE MOVED AGAIN.

All exhibits at the Show will receive reasonable care and attention, but the Secretary and Committee will not be liable for any loss or damage.

NO VEHICLES SHOULD BE MOVED ON FIELD BETWEEN 11 AM AND 4 PM
